

LA MUJER, SU PLUMA, Y EL PODER: HISTORIAL & TEXTUAL RECOVERY OF MEXICAN WOMEN WRITERS

This Charla first presents the history of Mexican women writers in the late 18th and early 19th century. Historically, women in Mexico and Latin American did not have the power of the pen. Dr. Cristina Ramírez will discuss research from her two books, *Occupying Our Space: The Mestiza Rhetorics of Mexican Women Journalists and Activists, 1875-1942* and her latest book, *Mestiza Rhetorics: An Anthology of Mexicana Activism in the Spanish Language Press, 1887-1922*. Dr. Ramírez reveals a series of historical women in Mexico who were courageous enough to claim their civic power and voice with their pen. Dr. Ramírez will also discuss the exciting research methods of archival research, textual recovery, and translation that can be done to create these historical research projects centered on Latin American figures.
